What have we been up to this week?

This week the children loved having the dentist visit! They listened attentively to the her advice on 'healthy teeth' and many children were brave receiving their fluoride treatment. In Maths, the children have been building on their understanding as they explore the concept of addition by adding more. The focus for this step is on increasing a quantity by a given amount, while continuing to work within 10. The children used real objects to see that the quantity of a group can be changed by adding more. The 'first, then, now' structure is a very effective way to help build their understanding by creating mathematical stories in meaningful contexts. We encouraged children to enact and represent number stories using ten frames, number tracks and their fingers. In Phonics we recapped previously learned graphemes, digraphs and trigraphs before we practised blending to read and write sentences containing CVCC words. Our story this week was called 'Rosie's walk' which focuses on prepositional language like 'under', 'around' and 'over'. The children were fantastic at creating wanted posters to find the naughty fox. It has been wonderful to see their confidence grow and produce independent pieces of writing.
