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Reading stories and asking questions to check understanding and comprehension.



Pre phase 2 - h sound

We will be looking at the n sound and beginning to identify and recognise.

Adaptive group will be using the h sound and other sounds that we have been learning to blend cvc words.

In math's the children will be continuing to observe the chicks to see how they have changed and grownusing the 10 frames to record the daily dairy

We will also talk about measuring trees using string and explaining that the wider the tree of a trunk the older it is. Children to measure the trees in the garden to compare and work out which is the youngest and oldest tree.



During the week the children will spend time outdoors hunting for minibeasts. Teachers to stretch out a white sheet beneath a tree branch and choose a child to shake the tree, without damaging the tree. If any minibeasts fall out, encourage the children to use a paintbrush to gently scoop minibeasts in the pot using the magnifying glasses and encouraging the children to use the bug classification sheets to check.

ession 1	Introduce the week and what the aims are. Talk through the expectations and behavior for the week and how the outdoors will look different to usual. Read Stanley's stick. Talk about the different things that Stanley used his stick for.	Read Wow said the Owl to the children and explain that they will get a chance to make their own Owls today. Recap on the expectations for the day. Explain the independent activities.	Talk about using the firepit today and talk through fire safety. Talk about Stop, drop and roll if the fire spits and how the children have to be sensible and the importance of staying in their seat.	Tree measuring. Talk about the trees in the Nursery garden. Are they the same/different? How can we tell? Look at the leaves and compare. Using pieces of wool of string, ask the children to work together to measure a different tree each, put a sticker when they have wrapped the string all the way round. Come back as a group and discuss which tree they think would have the widest trunk and why. Compare the strings and talk about the	Friday Making a bird feeder Pipe cleaner cheerio bird feeders.
